

POLICY ON CONFLICT MINERALS

Synergy Microwave Corporation is diligently developing controls to identify the sources of tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold (3TGs) used in its products, with commitment to source materials and components responsibly and ethically. The Democratic Republic of Congo ("DRC") and adjoining countries is a region where a number of minerals used in the electronics industry have been mined. This region has also experienced armed conflict and related human rights abuses. Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act imposes Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) reporting requirements upon publicly traded companies whose products contain metals derived from minerals defined as "Conflict Minerals" originating from the DRC and adjoining countries.

All of the necessary steps are being taken to comply with "Conflict Minerals" legislation. Synergy Microwave Corporation is currently in the process of contacting its suppliers regarding the origins of the "Conflict Minerals". Mineral mining and smelting precede several steps in the supply chain from integration into our products and it is a delayed and difficult task to trace back to each supplier of these minerals through the supply chain back to their mined resources.

If "Conflict Minerals" that originate in the "Covered Countries" are identified in our products, our effort will extend to attempt to determine if these minerals are a source of revenues to armed conflict in that region, and then as appropriate take the necessary steps to communicate through the supply chain and obtain other conflict free sources for these minerals.
